In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will participate in weekly professional development provided by the MIST for all math teachers and will utilize knowledge of students, the MAP/PARCC data, the learning continuum and alignment of Common Core Standards to the instructional program in the classroom through backward mapping and strategic use of data.</li> <li>2. In order to impact mathematics performance, staff will incorporate differentiated strategies that will address the diverse learning styles of the students through scaffolding, student-centered learning and choice in the classroom. Staff will work to align the curricula to the diverse perspectives of the students’ cultural backgrounds.</li> <li>3. **Reading Strategies:**

1. Incorporation of data discussions into grade and content team meetings that include the analysis of student data from MAP, PARCC and formative and summative assessments, as well as looking at the student holistically.
2. Informal and formal monitoring of teacher instructional practices through walk-throughs and observations (ongoing) using the Charlotte Danielson model in order to ensure that students are engaged in the lesson and that the lessons are designed to promote critical thinking and differentiation.
3. Incorporation of professional learning with offerings that encompass teacher mindset, differentiation, effective data conversations around leveraging student data and student centered learning.
